General Information Sheet – Please Read Carefully

Please ensure that all your windows and doors are securely shut. When in new surroundings cats will often explore or dart to a place to hide. They can escape through tiny gaps very quickly.

Make sure you have a litter tray ready and food and water is available. Put these and the cat in one calm room.

Most cats will wait until they feel secure to eat, so please do not worry if they do not eat in the first 48 hrs. Do not ever give them milk. Cats are lactose intolerant, it will give them diarrhoea and therefore possibly dehydration.

When your cat arrives, they will be stressed. This can sometimes cause diarrhoea. If so, and the cat seems fine otherwise, do not feed kittens for 12 hrs and adults for 24 hrs. Then introduce small meals or boiled chicken or non-oily white fish. Gradually introduce their normal food. They must have access to clean water at all times.

We highly recommend you get your new cat vaccinated and micro chipped once they are settled, and before you let them outdoors. This can save your cat's life and make finding a lost cat ten times more likely.

Your new cat should be kept indoors for the first 6-8 weeks to get used to you and their new surroundings. And not until they have been neutered and have had a week at least to recover from neutering.
